Albany, GA – In celebration of Earth Day, Flint River Fresh will host a Buckets of Compost and Plants Giveaway at the 5th Avenue Phoebe Community Garden in Albany on Friday, April 22nd.

Beginning at 2:00 p.m. until supplies run out, residents of Albany and Dougherty County can drive-up, take a bucket, fill it with organic compost, and select a tomato, pepper (hot, sweet, or bell), cucumber, squash, or okra plant to enrich home gardens. Supplies are limited - first come, first served.
